 - 1. Question #1: What role should the National Task Force on Hepatitis B play moving forward?
 - i) Answer via email from Thaddeus Pham: Focus on expanding clinician and healthcare team capacity:
 - (1) CE education
 - (2) Expert recs on guidance (e.g., treatment)
 - (3) Advocacy as clinical body
 - b) Question #2: Are standing monthly meetings necessary for us to accomplish our goals?
 - i) Answer via email from Thaddeus Pham: Not necessarily, but I think it is still good to convene and share updates...it helps to stay connected and network $\stackrel{igodymbol{eq}}{\simeq}$
 - ii) Answer via email from Becky Nguyen (VACF): For VACF, we see there is a need to address hepatitis B in our community and we are providing direct services with very limited resource. It is difficult to attend many meetings but we still would like to be a part of the taskforce. As for what role, it really depends on what we all as a group wanting to do. What's our goal(s) for the coming year?

Meeting notes summary (by Fathom - AI technology):

- The group discussed the role of the National Task Force on Hepatitis B and the necessity of their monthly meetings. They emphasized the importance of implementing routine testing, linkage to care, and vaccinations, as well as expanding clinician and healthcare team capacity for better progress in combating hepatitis B.
- The group discussed the feasibility of implementing changes in the healthcare system to address hepatitis B. They considered focusing on one aspect of the initiative and partnering with other organizations, while acknowledging the need for more discussions and setting specific goals for the future.
- The group discussed the frequency of their meetings and agreed to reduce the frequency to accommodate the busy schedules of physicians. They also discussed the possibility of assigning specific tasks to certain members to explore and report back on certain ideas or initiatives (instead of standing monthly meetings).
- The group discussed the role of the task force moving forward, including the importance of universal screening and vaccination recommendations, and the need to continue working towards hepatitis B elimination. They also discussed the frequency of future meetings, suggesting a quarterly schedule instead of monthly.

- Amy and Carol discussed the importance of effectively disseminating new recommendations to healthcare providers on the ground. They proposed strategies such as sending letters and slide sets to relevant organizations and partnering with pharmaceutical sponsors to support small projects for nationwide implementation.
- In the discussion, Carol, Amy, Lu-yu, Jacki, and Binh talked about the upcoming AASLD meeting and the opportunity to meet in person. They also discussed the need to promote the task force, share resources, and organize educational webinars and events related to viral hepatitis.
- Amy, Jacki, Binh, and others discussed the importance of raising awareness about a recurring issue and ensuring that people get tested, treated, and avoid its repetition. They expressed gratitude for the fruitful discussion and looked forward to seeing many at AASLD.
- c) Additional thoughts:
 - Let's do quarterly meetings with the next one Wednesday, January 10, 2024 (one week after the New Year); subsequent meeting Wednesday, April 10, 2024; July meeting may be in-person during the Hep B United Summit; and October 9, 2024.
 - ii) Many Hep B Task Force members are also actively involved in various hepatitis B initiatives, so it's best to conserve each other's time and energy for meetings. Also, there are many conferences that provide an opportunity for Task Force members to meet in person to further collaboration and network expansion.
 - iii) The Task Force will continue to serve as a means for sharing timely resources and information via email and on the website; this includes connecting members to funding opportunities, continuing to promote viral hepatitis ECHO programs across the country, and sharing technical assistance resources.
 - iv) Other additional thoughts and feedback will be collected by Amy Trang via email and direct phone calls.
